The employment participation rate in Australia for people with disabilities is only 52%. Unemployment is a major reason for poverty.

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High Unemployment in Hume Local Government Area Unemployment in Hume City is 1.3 times higher than the Australian average. Poverty is a major cause of housing stress and homelessness.



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We build resilience in local communities by creating a platform for social and digital inclusion to support and engage disadvantaged local groups.

Our Impact

- Delivered **36,396** hours of employability skills for **1,105** participants most likely to experience barriers to employment to improve job prospects.
- Applied Social impact discounts totalling \$27,589 allowing disadvantaged communities to access technology.
 - We advocate for the rights to a job, building resilience of disadvantaged communities through Employability Programs focused on reducing barriers to employment.

Our Impact

Created 23,250 hours of full award wage work and 32 Employment pathway outcomes; 4 referrals to further training, 15 casual and 13 part-time employment outcomes through Enable's enterprise trade, supporting local disadvantaged groups and economic development across Melbourne's north.

We advocate for and participate in social and sustainable procurement with business, government, and major contractors to create employment pathway outcomes, helping to reduce poverty in areas of high social and economic disadvantage.

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Our Impact

- Diverted over 327 tonnes of decommissioned technology from landfill for reuse and recycling (as a last resort).
- last resort).
 Distributed **750** affordable devices to communities in need.
- Engaged 289 Social and Sustainable Procurement Customers from Government, Corporate, business and not-for-profit sectors.
 - We are advocating for Social Enterprises to be included in local industry value chains and Circular Economy eco-systems.

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- We've created Renew (Affordable)
 Tech for Good initiative, refurbishing
 affordable technology for
 re-distribution to those in need.
- We work to reduce waste generation as well as improve air quality through reuse, repair, or re-purpose, and recycling e-waste where it cannot be salvaged.
- We actively promote the benefits of Social and Sustainable Procurement.
