Computer business makes old new again

A SOCIAL enterprise that aims to help the environment while boosting employment opportunities is coming to Hume.

Enable Social Enterprises this month relocated its computer recycling centre from Maribyrnong to the old Ericsson site in Belfast St, Broadmeadows.

Enable Social Enterprises provides employment pathways and work skills programs in municipalities including Hume, Darebin and Moreland, for people including those with a disability, migrants, youth at risk of disengagement and the long-term unemployed.

The Enable IT centre provides them with workplace experience in the e-waste recycling industry.

Enable Social Enterprises founder and managing director Julie McKay said the initiative was a registered charity, so customers were assured proceeds would be used to directly support some of the region's most vulnerable.

Enable IT delivers computer, phone and technology recycling, including a collection and data destruction service.
